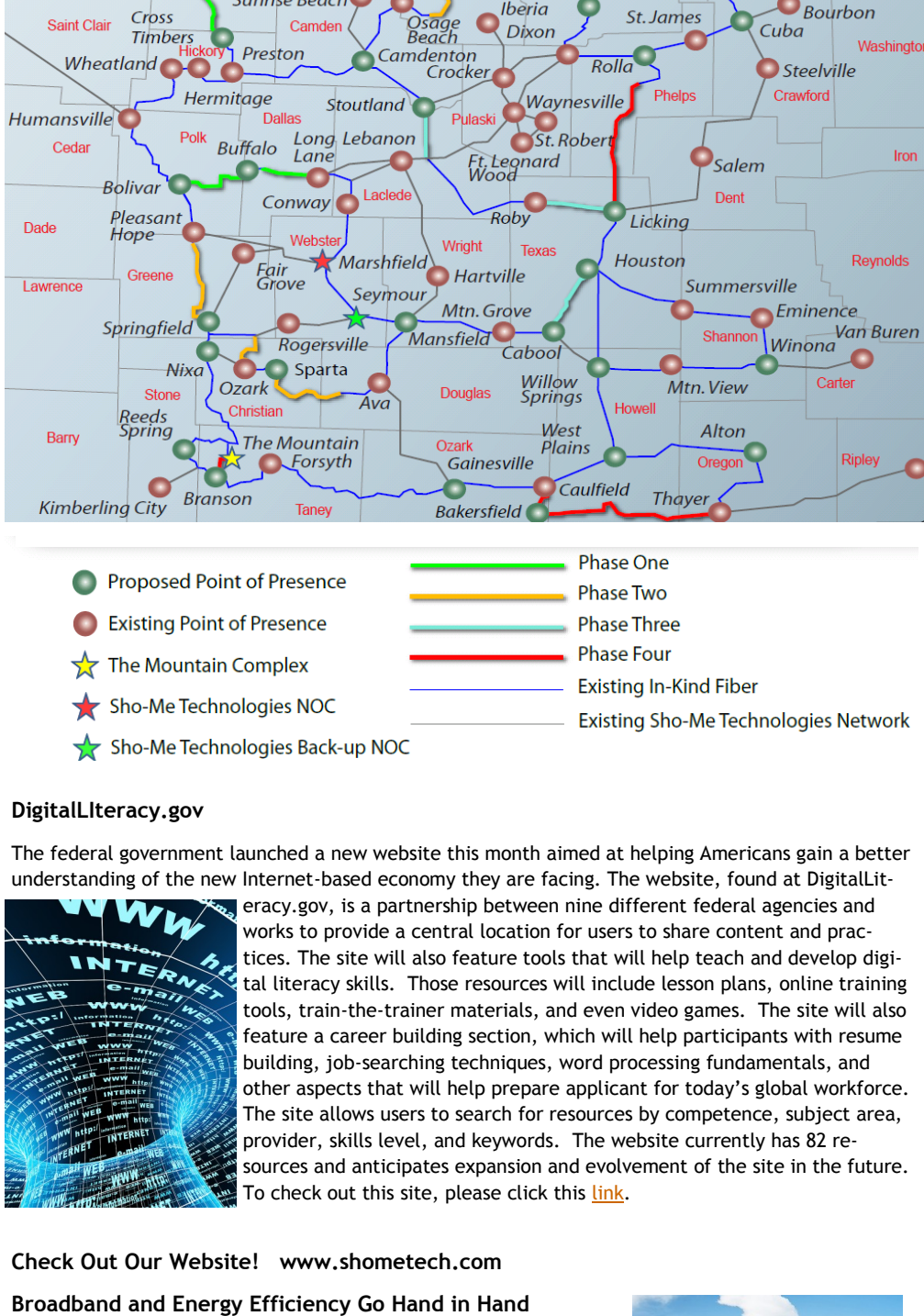


## Project Update

### DigitalLiteracy.gov

The federal government launched a new website this month aimed at helping Americans gain a better understanding of the new Internet-based economy they are facing. The website, found at [DigitalLiteracy.gov](http://DigitalLiteracy.gov), is a partnership between nine different federal agencies and works to provide a central location for users to share content and develop practical literacy skills. The site will also feature tools that will help teach and develop digital literacy skills. Those resources will include lesson plans, online training tools, train-the-trainer materials, and even video games. The site will also feature a career building section, which will help participants with resume building, job-searching techniques, word processing fundamentals, and other aspects that will help prepare applicant for today's global workforce. The site allows users to search for resources by competence, subject area, provider, skills level, and keywords.
