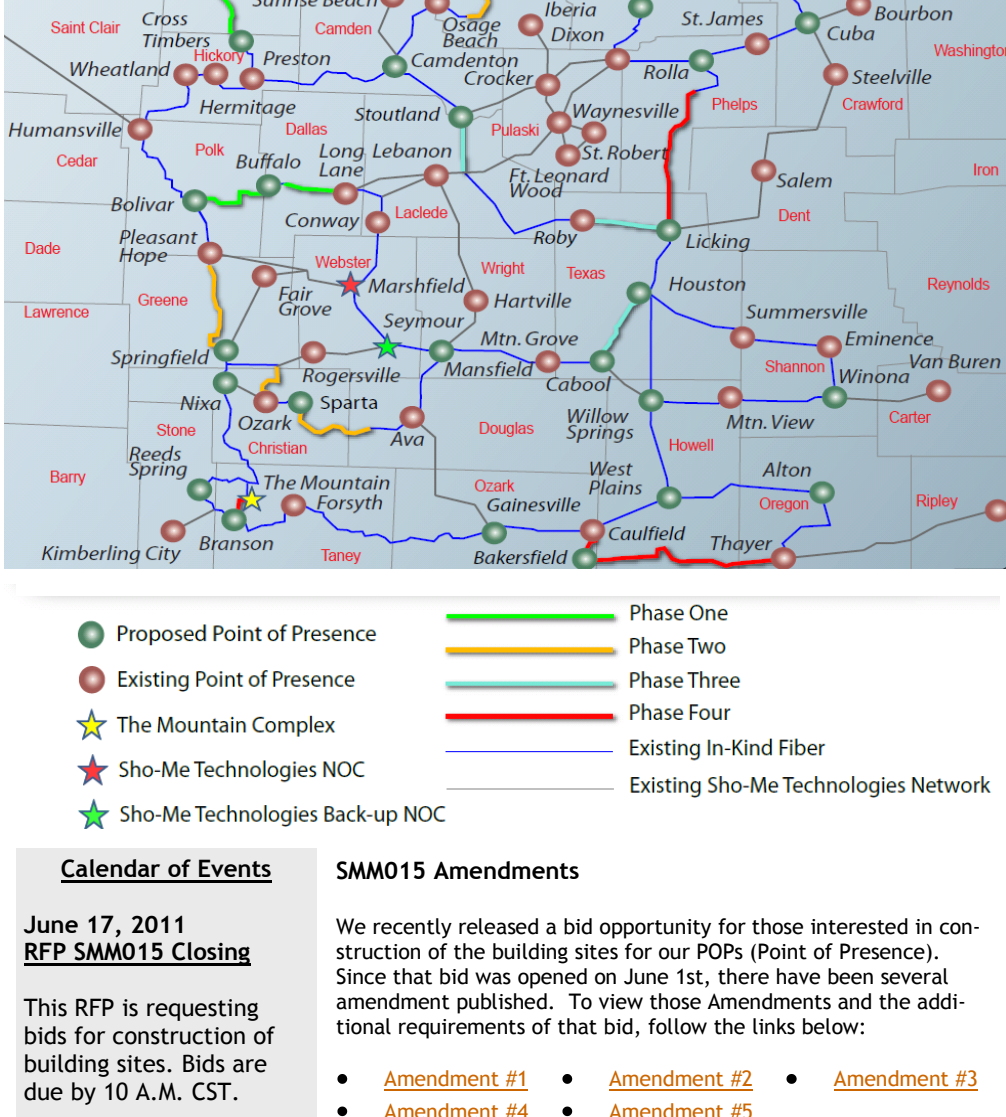


Project Update

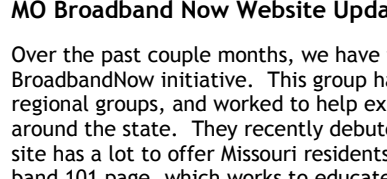

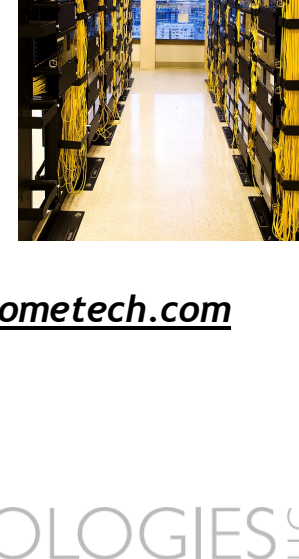


SMM010: Equipment Shelters
